The servants looked at each other in dismay. But they did what Jesus had told them to do. When the steward drank from the cup he was surprised. He turned to the bridegroom, saying, ‘Usually the best wine is served first and the ordinary wine is kept for last. But you have kept the best wine until now.’

Jesus had turned the water into wine. Jesus’ friends were amazed and began to wonder who he was. This was the first of many miracles that Jesus performed.


A noun is a word that is the name of a person, place, thing or idea.

2. Two people in the story are named. Who are they?


3. Other people are also mentioned but we are not told their names. Write those four words here.
