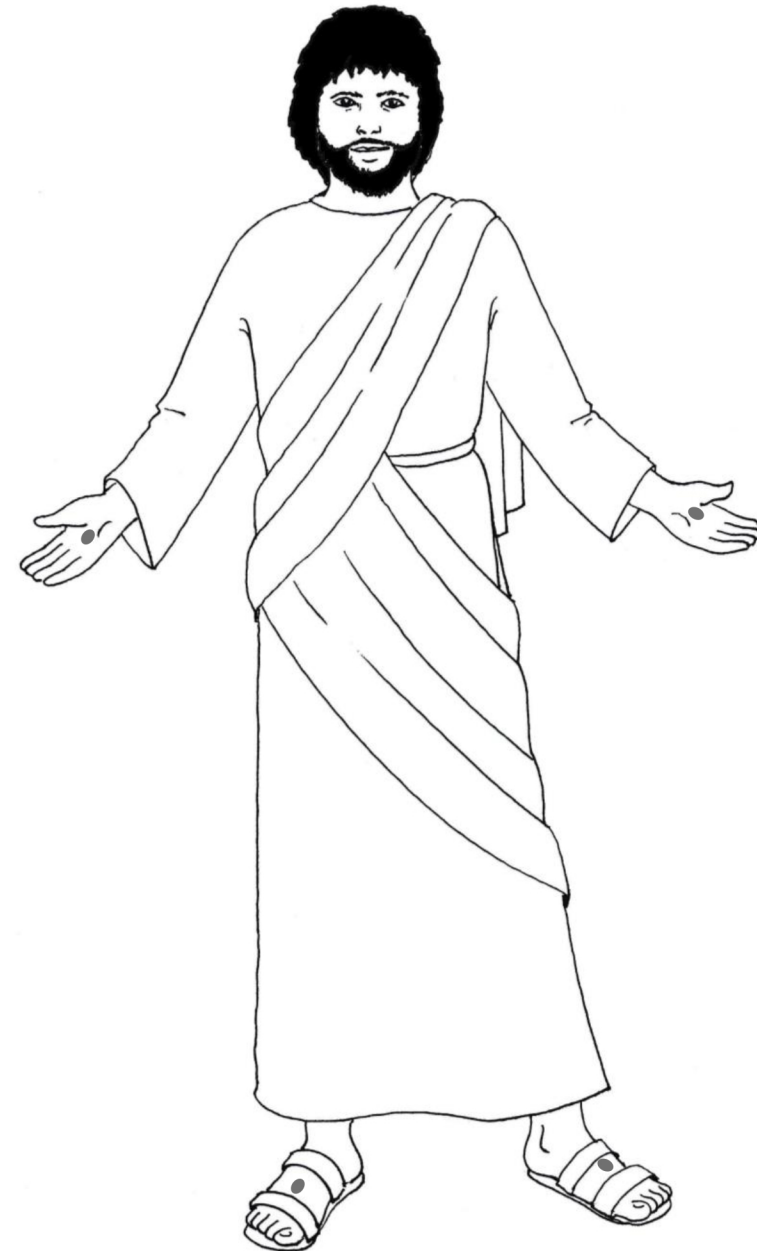
Doubting Thomas

After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his grieving disciples. But Thomas was not there. When Thomas returned, the joyful, awestruck disciples told him, 'We saw the Lord!' But doubting Thomas said, 'I will not believe it until I see the nail marks in his hands. And I will not believe until I put my finger where the nails were and put my hand into his side.' A week later the disciples were in the house again. This time Thomas was with them. The doors were locked because they were afraid, but Jesus came in and stood among the worried disciples. He said, 'Peace be with you!' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here. Look at my hands. Put your hand here in my side. Stop doubting and believe.' Thomas said to him, 'My Lord and my God!' Then Jesus told him, 'You believe because you see me. Those who believe without seeing me will be truly happy.'

An adjective is a word that describes a noun (the name of a thing or a place).

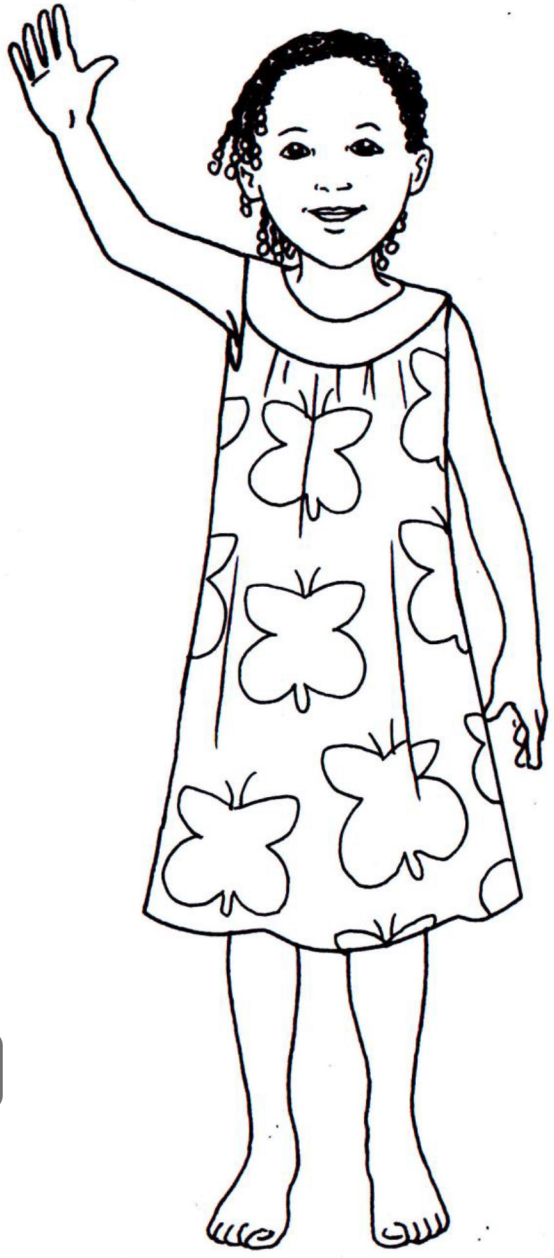
1. In the title **Doubting Thomas** which word is the noun and which is the adjective?
