

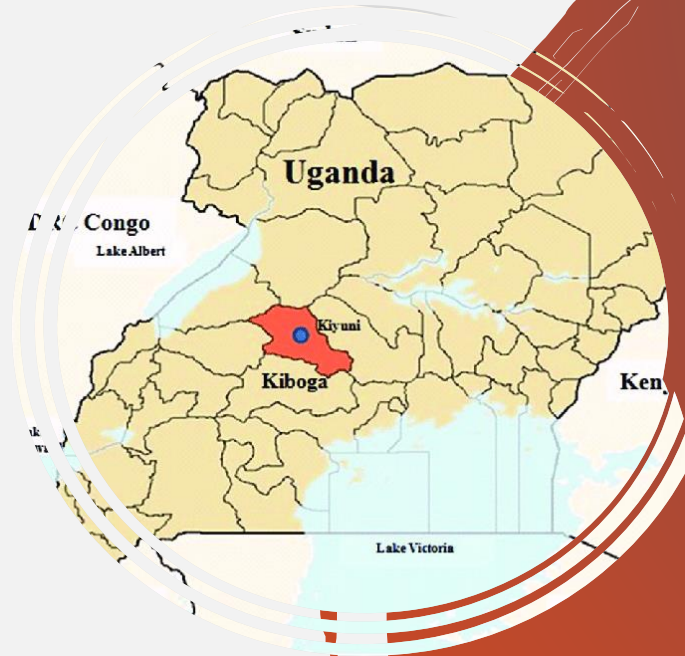

The project

Project Aim

This project seeks to improve sanitation in four primary schools by constructing or renovating pit latrines, ensuring gender-inclusive facilities, and fostering community ownership for sustained maintenance.

Situation Needs

In these primary schools, the pressing need for improved waste disposal and sanitation is evident, with many facing challenges such as full or collapsed latrines and the shared use of limited facilities by students and teachers. This compromised environment not only jeopardizes the health of our students but also hinders regular attendance. Swift action is imperative to address these critical issues and create a hygienic and inclusive learning space for the children in our care.



Enhance Sanitation Infrastructure:

Aim: To improve waste disposal and sanitation facilities in at least four primary schools within the Parishes by constructing or renovating pit latrines.



Ensure Gender-Inclusive Facilities:

Aim: To eliminate gender disparities in sanitation by providing separate and adequate toilet facilities for both male and female students, as well as teachers.



Promote Health and Attendance:

Aim: To enhance the overall health and well-being of pupils by improving sanitation, subsequently increasing school attendance and participation.



Sustainable Handover and Maintenance:

Aim: To ensure the long-term impact of the project, including its sustainability, by handing over the completed facilities to the school management committee for proper maintenance and continued benefit.



Project Aims

This project endeavors to transform the sanitation landscape in four primary schools within the Parishes by addressing critical issues such as full or collapsed latrines and the sharing of limited facilities among students and teachers. The primary aims include constructing or renovating pit latrines within a six-week timeframe, ensuring gender-inclusive sanitation facilities, promoting health, and ultimately increasing school attendance. By the project's completion, the improved sanitation infrastructure will be handed over to school management committees, fostering sustainability and community ownership for ongoing maintenance, thereby creating a healthier and more conducive learning environment.



Project Social need

The project is inclusive, respecting and refraining from any form of discrimination or interference with individuals' cultural or religious practices.

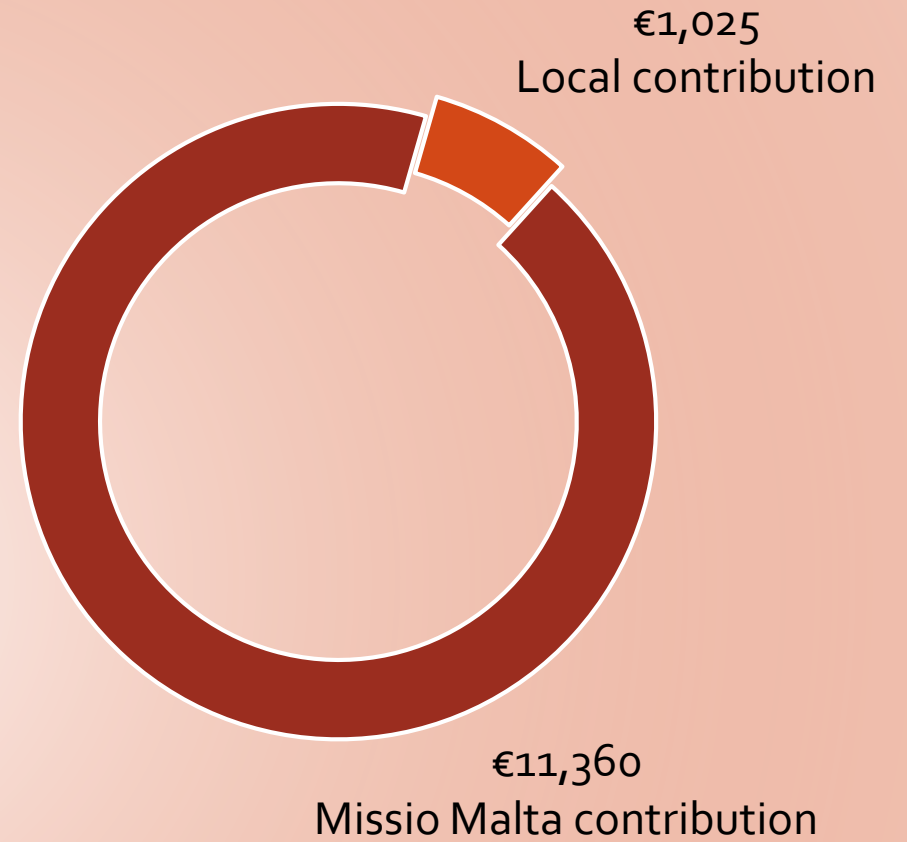
- 1. Construction of 4 PIT/Latrines with approximately of 6 weeks work on each*
